For those not noticing this change, the simple example of this change might be that a coin that was judged to be a very fine 20 last year might come back in a fine holder. It's the borderline coins between grades and the coins that have been cleaned that have been most affected. Open: The January 2025 meeting of the MECC was opened at 6pm with President Greg Shoaf welcoming the 14 members and three guests in attendance. He then led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Previous Minutes: Secretary Tim O'Keefe sent electronic copies of the November 2024 minutes to all members with e-mail addresses. Hard copies were available at tonight's meeting. There were no additions or corrections. There was a motion to accept the minutes as presented by Vice President Andrew Dearman, seconded by Kelly West. Motion passed.

Telephone Report: Despite some technical issues, Katherine Sayko was able to contact all members.

Old Business: 1) The Club's ANA membership is paid through February 2026. 2) Secretary O'Keefe is signing the contract with Stoney Creek Hotel and Conference Center for the Fall ONA Show in Broken Arrow. 3) The ANA Show in Oklahoma City is still on for August 19-23. They still need volunteers to be ambas-

sadors for Oklahoma. Contact Tim O'Keefe for further. 4) The Claremore Coin Club had their first meeting earlier this month. 18 people showed up and most of them joined the organization that night. Their next meeting is February 4 at the Claremore Community Center, 2301 N Sioux. (6p on a Tuesday). They may be moving to the Claremore Library in March.

Winter Board Meeting:

All Club offices were open for nomination and election. Two of the five Board Member positions were also open. Katie Hendricks, Keith Morgan, and Rich Wellnitz were not up for re-election. Nominations were taken from the floor. Mark Kephart advised he was stepping down as Treasurer. After discussion, officers are as follows: President Greg Shoaf, Board Member John Sayko, Vice President Andrew Dearman, Board Member Steve Aghar, Secretary Tim O'Keefe, Treasurer Phill Hughes.

Show And Tell - Phill Hughes showed an assorted collection of certified coins. Kelly West presented a 1903-S Morgan dollar. Tim O'Keefe showed a set of British Commonwealth coins and currency starting in the 1860s through the 1990s.

Auction - Ed Scott brought a few items that were bid on. The Club took in \$2 in surcharges.

Guests Steve and Gabriella Carney brought photos of their coin collection. The club discussed the ways they could proceed with the hobby.

Vice President Andrew Dearman and member RJ Lauchner became our second and third Lifetime members.

Previous Minutes: As there was no February meeting due to inclement weather, the January notes were up for approval. There was a motion by Vice President Andrew Dearman to accept the minutes as presented, seconded by President Shoaf.

Old Business:1) The World's Fair of Money Show sponsored by the

ANA is scheduled for August 19-23 in Oklahoma City. Member Keith Morgan gave us a list of expectations from his attendance and participation at previous shows. 2) Several members attended the early March show in Enid and said it went well. 3) The Claremore Coin Club is off to a great start and has a growing membership. 4) Gold & Silver of Muskogee has opened up at 20 E Shawnee Street in Muskogee. They are going to start a monthly Bid Board.

Membership: Fred Callicoat and Scott Lister joined the Club.

Show & Tell: Phill Hughes had two 1960 US Proof Sets, one with the small date cent and the other with the large date. He showed the group how to differentiate between the two. Keith Morgan showed a set of tiny ½ reales from Guatemala dated 1886, 1890, and 1895. Fred Callicoat showed some Barber coins he came across in a house he lives in. Secretary O'Keefe presented a collection of Oklahoma coin club, coin show, and coin shop tokens and exonumia going back about 70 years.

# What We Collect





**I**n the last issue of the Mint Luster I explained that a collection of old Mint Lusters had been donated to Oklahoma Numismatic Life Member Dale Schaffer (LM-94) at the Glenpool Black Friday Show in November. I have a fairly good idea who the donor was. Unfortunately attempts to contact him to confirm this have been unsuccessful, so I will respect his anonymity for the time being. Dale gave them to me to find them a good home. Meanwhile, for you veteran members of the Association, this will be a trip down memory lane. For us newcomers, here is how we got to where we are today

The ONA grew out of the old Oklahoma-Kansas Numismatic Association. I actually have a wooden nickel advertising the 8th OK-Kan Coin show held in Miami, OK, though I have not been able to track down the date yet. The popularity of the

hobby had progressed to the point where Oklahoma needed its own organization to keep up with the times. I found the following excerpt from the 1982 May-June issue:

“The history of the ONA has to start with the life of Jake B Sureck from Oklahoma City. Mr. Sureck has been a member of the ANA for 46 years, the University of Oklahoma graduate has served



that organization in numerous capacities over the years, and received the ANA Medal of Merit in 1969.

In his home state, Mr. Sureck was the founder and charter member of the Oklahoma City Coin Club and an organizer of the Oklahoma-Kansas Numismatic Association. He also served on the United States Assay Commission in 1967.

Jake Sureck began planning the ONA back in 1971. From 1971 to 1975 he talked to collectors and dealers about his dream for a state organization. On October 28, 1975 he addressed a small group of collectors concerning the need for such an organization. From that group, the necessary spark just wasn't there to start such an organization.

On June 6, 1976, a second meeting was held. A dark cloud of pessimism prevailed among the 24 persons present. Mr. Sureck stated that we could drop the whole idea or bull our way through with a modest beginning. This fired the imagination and everybody said "lets try". Mr. Sureck appointed temporary officers and stated the purpose of the ONA to promote numismatic development in the state and to coordinate its activities."

The back issues have been a

wealth of information as to the early workings of the ONA. I joined the ONA back in 2011 but have seen little background information on the organization.

The records I inherited when I took over as Secretary/Treasurer in 2020 from the late Shane Cornell (LM-159) were extremely incomplete. Shane's record keeping was spotty at best, especially when it came to who was on the membership list. (I'm not bashing. The system worked for him). It seems that as our members either died or moved without a forwarding address, he would delete all of their information from the rolls. This has led to a few awkward encounters over the years as people approach me at shows asking what happened to their Mint Lusters, and I have had no answers to give them.

The issues I have start with the July-August 1981 issue of the Mint Luster (Yes, we published 6 times a year back then). Each publication starts with an ONA roll call of Club officers with contact information for each. We also had appointed officers, such as a Historian, a Publicity Director, a Medals Chairman, an ANA representative, an Educational Director, a Youth Representative, a Legal Advisor, and a Convention Chairman. I can just imagine how long the board meetings lasted. There was also a page dedicated to new members,

which sometimes listed as many as 60 new people per issue. There was also a continuing two page spread covering the percentage of silver and gold in foreign coins provided by Marion "The Rizz" Risley (LM-13). There were a few coin-related articles, the President's message, a listing of upcoming shows, and lots of advertising for coin dealers in and out of Oklahoma.

As far as membership, Shane had deleted most of the original members from his database. Thankfully, 1982 Secretary Grady Leatherwood listed the Life Members the association had up until that time in the May-June issue. The first 250 members of the ONA were given "C" numbers to indicate Charter Member. I thought it would be interesting to show the first 10 ONA members: Jake B Sureck, William B Thompson, EL "Bob" Bills, Monte D Rogers, Dave Richardson, Carl J Schlosser, Douglas Drain, Cecil W Morris, Grady Leatherwood, and Jerry W Brown.

Speaking of medals, the ONA used to commission artists to produce a yearly medal starting in 1979. These medals were made of bronze and silver and depicted some historical fact about Oklahoma. I was able to locate a partial list of the medals, which were sold in sets (plastic cases

that were individually numbered) or separately. (Some are available on ebay):

- 1979---Will Rogers
- 1980---Pioneer Woman
- 1981---Wichita Wildlife Refuge
- 1982---Goddess of The Harvest
- 1983---General Stand Watie, CSA
- 1984---Soil Conservation
- 1985---Rodeo Cowboy
- 1986---End of The Trail
- 1987---Santa Fe Railroad
- 1988---Out of The Past (Land Rush)  
    Into The Future (Space)
- 1990---Cowboy Hall of Fame
- 1993---The Cherokee Strip
- 1995---The Five Civilized Tribes

Bill Thompson (LM-2) is responsible for the ONA design that appears on all the medals and our Association logo. I have several of the bronze medals, along with the 1979 Will Rogers bronze/silver set. Thanks to Paul Miller (LM-46) for compiling the medal list. These medals preserve the history of the organization. In one of the 1980's issues of Mint Luster the leadership skipped an issue in order to have funds to pay for the medals.

And I would be amiss if I did not mention the Clubs that have been part of the ONA. Early Clubs were given a "CC" designation for Charter Clubs. The records have gaps and are incomplete. Here is a list of what is available:

Comanche County Coin Club, Woodward County Coin Club, Stephens County Coin Club, Lucky Penny Coin Club (OKC), Tulsa Coin Club, Oklahoma City Coin Club, Magic Empire Coin Club (Tulsa), Enid Coin Club, Guymon Coin Club, Norman Coin Club, Capitol City Coin Club (OKC), Miami Coin Club, Bordertown Coin Club (Ft Smith, AR), Indian Territory Coin Club (McAlester), NW Arkansas Coin Club (Rogers, AR), Central Oklahoma Coin Club (Guthrie), Custer County Coin Club, Hub City Coin Club (Clinton) and the Sand Springs Coin Club.

In 1987, we had the following clubs under our purview:

Guymon Coin Club, Woodward Coin Club, Enid Coin Club, Osage Coin Club, Ponca City Coin Club, Bartlesville Coin Club, Miami Coin Club, Hub City Coin Club (Clinton), Oklahoma City Coin Club, Lucky Penny Coin Club (OKC), Stillwater Junior Coin Club, Pioneer Coin Club (Stillwater), Magic Empire Coin Club (Tulsa), Tulsa Coin Club, Oklahoma Paper Money Society (Tulsa), Sand Springs Coin Club, Indian Capital Coin Club (Muskogee), Green Country Numismatic Society, Comanche County Coin Club, Stephens County Coin Club, Silver Circus Coin Club, and the Ardmore Coin Club.

I was able to clear up one major conundrum. After Shane passed, his family gave me several boxes related to the ONA. One container held about one hundred or so ONA lapel pins with no explanation. They are well preserved, but none of the senior members I spoke with knew anything about them. In the November-December 1984 issue there is a full-page ad for the pins from Treasurer Bill Thompson. The pins are divided into two categories- ONA and ONA Life Members. The regular pins were to be sold for \$2.50 each, while the LMs were to be given to the Life Members for free. I will have the lot with me at the May Board meeting to see how the membership wishes to proceed with dispersal.

Among some of the folks who were ONA President during this period were Jake Sureck (LM-1), Douglas Drain (LM-7), Butch Stephens (LM-36), Barbara Teasley (LM-20), Marion "The Rizz" Risley (LM-13), and Bob Bills (LM-3). In 1984, Risley and Bills exchanged Lifetime numbers, with Rizz getting LM-3 and Bills taking LM-13. I met Butch Stephens at the Tulsa Show a few years back, which is where I obtained many of my ONA medals. Butch set up a dealer table, coming all the way from Missouri. I was also warmly surprised to find that 10 of the origi-

nal 250 ONA Charter Members are still receiving the Mint Luster.

As I brought up in the last issue, the Newman Numismatic Portal is currently adding back issues of national newsletters to their archive. This archive is free on the internet. I am going to hold onto these issues through the May 2025 ONA Show, then forward them to their organization for scanning.

These issues also chronicled the annual shows in Tulsa and Oklahoma City. Maps showing where dealer tables were located were provided before the shows. Exhibits were also a large part of the shows. We ran Youth Exhibits at the Tulsa Show 2020-2022, but we have had a difficult time maintaining interest. There also used to be a Wine & Cheese Party held after Set Up on Day 1 for all Lifetime Members to attend.

It was also interesting to see what the Association was discussing back then. "Red River Rumors" was a continuing column giving tidbits of rumors and coin related musings. There was a lot of concern about the legislature making rules to have coin dealers licensed. There was also a movement by the ONA to start a building fund so we would have our own place in the State. I have no record on how far this endeavor progressed. And in July 1984 the ONA made a sizeable donation to

victims of the Memorial Day Flood in Tulsa.

And then there were awards. The ONA used the Okie Award as a yearly recognition of the member who did the most for the Association in the prior 12 months. We reinstated this last year at the Moore Show (Congratulations to Scott Thompson of Central States Coin Club in Guthrie). There was Club recognition, which rotated between Most Improved Club and Most Valuable Club in its title. And in the mid-1980s, Butch Stephens gave out a trophy recognizing the member who recruited the highest number of new members during the year.

The ONA has a proud history. I enjoyed going through these books as a window to the past. It is good to recall our beginnings. In 1990, the Oklahoma City Coin Club commissioned a commemorative coin to honor Jake Sureck. There are several wooden nickels out there from our present and former Clubs. (Check the internet, coin shops, and coin shows). This was a great opportunity to review and learn about the Association, and I thank our anonymous donor for holding onto the newsletters. And at the May 2025 Show in Moore look for a new ONA elongated cent.
